August 19, 2019		The best way to see one of the most historic cities in America. This tour will traverse through Charleston's "Historic District" at a leisurely pace reliving almost 350 years of history. The tour also includes The Citadel, which was established in 1842 and was originally located on Marion Square in beautiful downtown Charleston, SC. Today the picturesque campus, which was moved in 1922 to the bank of the Ashley River, is home to 24 major buildings and over 3,400 men and women enrolled in over 20 full and part time graduate and undergraduate programs. While touring The Citadel, guests will walk the parade ground, drive around the campus, experience Summerall Chapel and visit the gift shop.

August 21, 2019		One of Charleston's premiere venues. Patriot's Point features the USS Yorktown (aircraft carrier), USS Laffey (destroyer) and USS Clamagore (submarine), a Vietnam era support base, the US Medal of Honor Museum (USS Yorktown). (USS Albany Memorial Service included)
	1:30-4pm	Fort Sumter Ferry/Tour On April 12, 1861, Confederate forces fired on Union forces in Charleston Harbor, thus beginning the American Civil War. The focal point was Fort Sumter and is today a reminder the bloodiest war in American history. Tour leaves from Patriot's Point following lunch.
